LEGAL NETWORK TO PROPOSE IMMEDIATE STEPS TO FIX CANADA'S ACCESS TO MEDICINES REGIME

TORONTO, April 16, 2007 — Prior to its appearance before the House of Commons Standing Committee on Industry, Science and Technology, the Canadian HIV/AIDS Legal Network will give journalists an advance briefing on urgently needed reforms to Canada's Access to Medicines Regime.

The Regime, passed almost three years ago as the *Jean Chrétien Pledge to Africa*, was intended to allow generic drug companies in Canada to produce and export much-needed lower-cost versions of brand-name drugs to developing countries. To date, however, not a single pill has left Canada. The Regime is currently under review by both the Committee and the Government.
