## **RELEASE OF NEW POLL RESULTS HIGHLIGHTS HEALTH ISSUES ABSENT FROM FEDERAL ELECTION CAMPAIGN: NATIONAL DRUG STRATEGY AND FUNDING FOR AIDS**
