EXPERT PANEL BEFORE PARLIAMENT TO DISCUSS REFORMING ACCESS TO MEDICINES REGIME

OTTAWA, October 20, 2009 — Two leading NGOs will appear before the Senate's Standing Committee on Banking, Trade and Commerce to explain why Senators should fix Canada's Access to Medicines Regime (CAMR), which has so far delivered little by way of affordable medicines for AIDS and other diseases to developing countries. Médecins Sans Frontières will outline the difficulties it faced in trying, without success, to use CAMR to help patients it is treating. The Canadian HIV/AIDS Legal Network will outline how Bill S-232 aims to streamline the current law to make it more user-friendly and effective in a manner consistent with Canada's international legal obligations.
