## GRANNIES HOLD VIGILS URGING PARLIAMENT TO SUPPORT ACCESS TO MEDICINES BILL

Events planned across Canada to mark World AIDS Day

Canada-wide, November 30–December 3, 2010 — Grandmothers and grand-others across the country are holding vigils outside of the offices of Members of Parliament to mark World AIDS Day. They are urging MPs to amend and support Bill C-393, on which the final stage of debate will soon resume in Parliament. Bill C-393 aims to streamline Canada's Access to Medicines Regime, which was created by Parliament in 2004 with the goal of getting lower-cost generic medicines for AIDS and other public health problems to developing countries but has failed to deliver. With more than 1.8 million people dying of AIDS in 2009, including 260 000 children, the opportunity presented by the proposed legislation must be seized.

These vigils are organized by the National Advocacy Committee of the Grandmothers to Grandmothers Campaign in support of African grandmothers who are raising millions of children orphaned by HIV/AIDS, as well as other civil society groups and concerned Canadians.
