## GRANDMOTHERS RINGING THE BELL FOR DEMOCRACY; URGE SENATE TO QUICKLY PASS BILL C-393

Liberal Senator Roméo Dallaire and Conservative Senator Nancy Ruth call on colleagues to do the right thing in support of accessible medicines for all

The campaign to fix Canada's Access to Medicines Regime — so that more affordable life-saving medicines can get to developing countries — has one more round to go. But time is running out. MPs voted in favour of Bill C-393 (172 for and 111 against) at third reading on March 9th. Bill C-393's passage in the House of Commons means it must now be passed by a majority vote in the Senate — and this must happen before Parliament is dissolved, which could happen within days. If an election is called before Bill C-393 passes through the Senate and receives Royal Assent, the bill will die on the order paper — for a second time.

Fortunately, the Senate's procedures allow for it to pass Bill C-393 this week. It is up to the Senators to pass this humanitarian legislation quickly.
